The Development Office has received a \$50,000 challenge grant from the Constantin Foundation. The challenge, however, is to raise \$50,000 from new donors (those who have not given in at least three years) in order to receive the Foundation's grant. The current UD Fund total is approximately \$451,000 but the goal is \$650,000 by May 31. The Development Office staff will be calling on alumni, parents, friends, corporations, faculty and staff to help them meet the challenge. As the figures indicate, it will go a long way to meeting the UD Fund goal.
