## NOTES

McDermott Lectureship: Fr. David Balas reports that the final arrangements are being made to bring Professor Paul Ricoeur to campus. The time of Professor Ricoeur's visit has been moved from April 6 through 26 to April 20 through May 3. During this time he will give two public lectures: 7:30 p.m., April 22, in Lynch Auditorium, "Philosophy and Language" and 7:30 p.m., April 29, at Temple Emanu-El, 8500 Hillcrest Road in Dallas, "The Symbolic Structure of Action."

The City of Irving Arts Board has awarded the University \$1,500 in support of a spring exhibition, "Prints in Suites," sponsored by the department of art. Eight nationally-known printmakers will be invited by Juergen Strunck, associate professor of art, to exhibit a "suite" or series of six to eight prints March 9 through April 11, 1981. At least two public lectures will be offered on the exhibition in March and April; the exhibition will travel to other galleries following the showing in the Haggerty Art Center gallery. A portion of the Arts Board's support will help underwrite a poster that will publicize and commemorate the exhibition. Mr. Strunck worked with the Development Office in preparing the proposal for support.

Trudy Smith, formerly the secretary in the art department is now the secretary to Fr. David Balas, Graduate Dean and Director of the Institute of Philosophic Studies; Sue Mundell is now the secretary in the art department.

A German film with English subtitles will be shown in Lynch Auditorium, Tuesday, Jan. 27. The film, "Tonio Krueger," from a work by Thomas Mann, is somewhat autobiographical of Mann, showing the role of an artist in society as being different than the position of ordinary people.

Celebration of the Feast of St. Thomas Aquinas. Although the feast day of St. Thomas is January 28th, this celebration will be January 29th at 7:30 p.m. in Lynch Auditorium. The brief symposium is entitled, "The Humanism of Aquinas." Lectures and discussions will be presented by Rev. Fabio Giardini, O.P., former dean of the Angelicum in Rome who will review the life and work of St. Thomas; Rev. Larry Burke, doctoral candidate at the University of New Mexico, who will discuss the "moral humanism" in Aquinas which has ramifications in such diverse areas as medicine and asceticism; Dr. Mark Jordan of the UD Philosophy Dept. will complement Fr. Burke's presentation by discussing the "humanistic origins" of Aquinas. A little reception will follow at the Dominican Priory.

This Friday and Sunday, the Student Government film is "The Muppet Movie." The movie begins at 7:30 p.m., Lynch Auditorium. No admission fee.

Carlo Pezzimenti, one of America's finest classical guitar talents, will perform this Sunday, Feb. 1, at 3 p.m., in Lynch Auditorium. The performance is sponsored by Lecture and Fine Arts.

"The Coronation Mass," best-known of Mozart's Salzburg Masses, will be sung in Latin by the Dallas Catholic Choir and U.D. Student Soloists, January 31, at the Holy Family Catholic Church in Irving. The performance will begin at 6:30 p.m.
