Computer Animation of Chemical Reactions--CHARLES W. EAKER, Chemistry Professor, is continuing to develop methods that make use of a graphics microcomputer to demonstrate the motions of atoms and molecules in chemical reactions. The research involves developing mathematical descriptions of the potential energy surfaces which govern the reactions. From these surfaces the motions of the atoms and molecules are determined and then displayed on a cathode-ray tube.
