Education is much more associated with religion than politics, Dr. Donald A. Cowan, President of the University of Dallas, said in Fort Worth Tuesday.

Dr. Cowan told members of the Fort Worth operating fund campaign for the University of Dallas, that education is involved with the protection "of the faith."

Dr. Cowan challenged the campaign leadership at the Fort Worth club luncheon saying that, "Education is not possible except through the reformation of a person, then his transformation of a being who was incomplete and limited to one who has begun the lifelong process of unfolding the potential of a being made in the image of God."

Dr. Cowan explained that, "the University of Dallas is church sponsored, but not church supported." "There is no chance for complacency," he said, "no sitting back on the oars because support must be won year by year from the most important citizenry of the region."

In challenging Fort Worth to raise \$20,000 as part of a \$300,000 total needed for 1968 operations, Dr. Cowan emphasized that, "the education of our youth is a great work. It is a work that belongs to many people. A Catholic University works and gets the support of many more than Catholics. It is the work of the work of the church not at the hierarchical level, not in its liturgical function, but at the level of you and me, in the function of God in bringing to the children of God, the realization of being made in His image."
