"PRAYER AND POLITICS" and "Fidelity to God and Not Calculation" will be subjects of the 1980 Gorman Lectures on Friday (Feb. 8) beginning at 4:30 p.m. in the Gorman Lecture Center Faculty Lounge. Father Enda McDonagh, Husking Professor of Moral Theology at the University of Notre Dame, and Fredrick Carney, professor of Christian ethics at Southern Methodist University's Perkins School of Theology, are this year's guest lecturers. Father McDonagh will present his lecture on "Prayer and Politics" at 4:40 p.m. Carney will speak on "Fidelity to God and Not Calculation" at 7:30 p.m. Dr. Leo Paul de Alvarez (Politics Department chairman) will respond to Father McDonagh's lecture. A response to Carney's lecture will be made by Father William Finan (Theology). A panel discussion of the lectures and responses, including audience participation, will conclude the program. Panelists will be Father David Balas (Theology chairman), Carney, Dr. de Alvarez, Father Finan, Father McDonagh and Dr. James Patrick (Dean of University Affairs).

The Gorman Lectures were established in 1975 in honor of Bishop Thomas K. Gorman. Its purpose is to bring recognized scholars to the University to discuss problems of vital importance for theology and Christian living.

ECONOMIST JAMES M. BUCHANAN, an internationally recognized expert on public finance and taxation, will present the first of eight lectures in the GSM's Management Classics Lectures for the spring term at 5:30 p.m. today in Lynch Auditorium. Buchanan's topic will be "Balanced Budget Amendment." The guest lecturer is currently director of the Institute of Economic Affairs in London; the Committee on Urban Public Economics; the President's Task Force on Model Cities; and the International Institute for Economic Research in Economics and Education.

DR. JOSEF SEIFERT (Philosophy) has been notified of the acceptance of his paper entitled "Does the Existence of Truth Depend on Man?" for the 1980 conference of the Metaphysical Society of America. Also, in Austin at the annual meeting of the Southwestern Philosophical Society, Dr. Seifert read a response paper on "Meinong's Solution of Some Paradoxes" which will be published in the "Southwestern Journal of Philosophy. Another paper, "The Nature of Liberal Arts Education: It's Timeless Significance and It's Present Actuality" has been included in the first issue of a new journal entitled "Renaissance Universal." Dr. Seifert's book, The Body/Mind Problem in Comtemporary Philosophical Discussion, is now on sale in the University bookstore.
