WHAT CATHOLICS BELIEVE, the 1980 Lenten Lectures presented by the Theology Department, will continue on Thursday at 8 p.m. in the Hagggar University Center Upstairs Dining Room. This week, Dr. Bernard Batto will address the theme of "Glory--Transfiguration" as presented in Matthew 17 (1-9). The six-week series was launched last week when Father Cho D. Phan lectured on "The Desert Experience--Temptation of Jesus." On Thursdays for the remainder of the Lenten season, members of the Theology Department will lecture on classical themes of Christian faith and experiences in the spirit of Lent viewed in light of the contemporary theological renewal. On March 6, Father Enrique Nardoni will lecture on "Baptism--Samaritan Women." On March 13, Father David Balas (Theology chairman) will lecture on "Faith--The Cure of the Man Born Blind." On March 20, Father Christopher Rabay will lecture on "Grace--The Raising of Lazarus." And on March 27, Father Thomas Carroll will lecture on "Eucharist--Bethany--At Table with Lazarus."

DR. ERICH HELLER, Avalon Professor in the Humanities at Northwestern University, will begin his residence as UD's 1980 McDermott Lecturer next week. An internationally recognized authority and interpreter of modern German philosophy, literature and poetry, Dr. Heller will conduct graduate classes in the Institute of Philosophic Studies and will participate in a number of University activities during his stay through March 16. On Wednesday, March 5, he will speak before the North Texas Chapter of the American Association of Teachers of German in the Gorman Lecture Center Faculty Lounge. The main public event of Dr. Heller's visit will be his McDermott Lecture, "The Poet in the Age of Prose," on March 13 at 8 p.m. in Lynch Auditorium.
