

New University Has Registration Of 245 Students

The University of Dallas, which has just completed its first week of operations, has a total of 245 students registered, president F. Kenneth Brasted told a meeting of the Holy Name Society of St. Augustine's Church.

Speaking at a meeting in the church hall, 1064 St. Augustine Drive, Dr. Brasted said that 180 students are enrolled in the regular session and 65 in the Saturday morning session conducted for teachers and working adults.

Contrary to popular belief, there are actually more male students than women undergraduates among the students enrolled in the regular session, if nursing education students are not counted, Dr. Brasted pointed out. Students from St. Paul's School of Nursing, Dallas, and St. Joseph's School of Nursing, Fort Worth, take their academic work at the university but do not reside on the campus.

Dr. Brasted said that the university departments were all operating smoothly after registration and the problems incidental to the opening of the university had been taken care of.
