## Notes:

On Wednesday, March 3rd the White House announced that DR. MELVIN E. BRADFORD, professor of English Literature at UD, has been appointed to the 12 member Board of Foreign Scholarships which administers the Fulbright Scholarship Programs.

JEFF ELMER, a senior math major, and BILL CERNOSEK, a freshman math major, entered the 3rd Annual Southwest Regional Mathematics competition at the University of Texas at Arlington on Saturday, February 27th. The competition for undergraduates consisted of a test and a paper presentation. There were 36 participants from eight schools in the test and three participants in the undergraduate paper competition. JEFF placed first in both parts of the competition. This was the first time in the history of the competition that a student placed first in both events. Teams were also ranked, and the University of Dallas team of JEFF and BILL ranked first. In addition, THERESA KELLY, a 1981 U.D. alumna who is now in graduate school at U.T. Arlington, entered a paper in the graduate competition. DR. ANDY BERNER of the Math Department was the faculty sponsor and chauffeur.
