

Dr. Richard P. Olenick, assistant professor of physics, and Dr. Kathleen A. Martin, assistant professor of education, are project co-directors of a national television show to be developed for high school students. The National Science Foundation has awarded \$650,000 to the California Institute of Technology to adapt portions of "The Mechanical Universe," a college-level physics course for national television, for use by high school students. Olenick and Martin as the project's co-directors will work with 12 outstanding high school physics teachers and administrators this summer at Caltech on the film project. Three hours of videotapes appropriate for high school students will be developed.
