THE OBSERVANCE OF THE LENTEN SEASON will begin at 5 p.m., February 28, in Maher Athletic Center with a special liturgy. There will be an opportunity for the reception of the Sacrament of Penance and the distribution of ashes. The daily Mass schedule will be the same during Lent--Monday through Friday, noon and 5 p.m.; and Saturday at 10 a.m. Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament will take place in St. Thomas Aquinas Chapel from 4 to 5 p.m. on the Thursdays of Lent. Stations of the Cross, a time of meditation on the passion and death of Our Lord, will be held at 6:15 p.m. on the Fridays of Lent in Lynch Auditorium. Beginning on March 6 and ending April 5, a Lenten series of eight lectures will be given by the Theology Department on "What Catholics Believe." The subject matter will be up-dated theology for all Catholics and an introduction to Catholic theology for those non-Catholics interested in knowing more about the Catholic religion. All lectures will be held in the Haggar meeting room, except the March 8 lecture which will be held in the upstairs dining room from 8 to 9:30 p.m. The Mass of the Lord's Supper will be held at 7:30 p.m. on Holy Thursday in Lynch Hall. It will be followed by Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament from 8:30 p.m. to midnight in the St. Thomas Aquinas Chapel. Celebration of First Communion for the children of the Parish will be held. The Celebration of the Lord's Passion will be held at 2:30 p.m. Good Friday in Lynch Hall. Stations of the Cross will be held at 7:30 p.m. in Lynch, followed by a film. An Easter Vigil will begin at 7:30 p.m. Holy Saturday in Lynch, with a Light Service celebrating the Lord's Resurrection. There will be no 5 p.m. Mass. Easter services will be held at 11 a.m. in Lynch Hall (Community Mass) and 10 a.m. in St. Thomas Aquinas Chapel (Latin Mass).
